

Dr. Harrison became the second president of CSUMB in June 2006, following the departure of Dr. Peter Smith. Her previous post was as vice president of academic quality at Florida State University. She came to CSUMB with over 30 years of educational experience, all with FSU. She began her career at Florida State as a professor in the School of Social Work and soon became dean.

Harrison received her B.A. in American studies from the University of Alabama where she also received her Master of Social Work. She has a Ph.D. in social work from Washington University.

Howard Gauthier, Ph.D.

Howard recently began his inaugural year as CSUMB Athletic Director. He has over 20 years experience and was most recently the athletic director for Southwest Minnesota State University. He also held that post at Idaho State University and at Briar Cliff College in Iowa. In addition to these duties, he has served as head basketball coach at Eastern Oregon and Wartburg College, Iowa.

Gauthier received his B.A. in business administration from Washington State University, an M.S. in sports management from the University of St. Thomas in Florida, and a Ph.D. in education from Southern Illinois University.

#### **Head Coach Amber Magner**

Amber Magner is in her sixth year as the head coach for CSUMB Women's Basketball. The all-time winningest coach, she has coached six all-conference performers and an NAIA Academic All-American. Prior to CSUMB, Magner served as assistant coach at Furman and New Orleans. Magner played at Ventura College, Loyola Marymount, and New Orleans. While at UNO she was an All-Academic Scholar Athlete, three-time member of the Sunbelt Conference Commissioners All Academic Team (1995-1998), team captain, and held the single season three-point record. A native of Palmer, Alaska, Magner has a B.A. and Master of Education in sports mangament from New Orleans. She is also director of CSUMB intramurals and resides in Marina.



#### **Assistant Coach Brianna Chambers**

Brianna Chambers is in her third year as the assistant coach for CSUMB Women's Basketball. Chambers was a member of the first women's basketball team at Cal State Bakersfield. Along with basketball she lettered in softball and basketball at Menlo College. Prior to CSUMB, Chambers was the head coach of the Bakersfield Heat, an AAU travel team. Chambers lives in Marina and has a B.S. in communications from Cal State Bakersfield.





#### **Graduate Assistants Karly Castro and Tes Soracco**

Former players Karly Castro and Tes Soracco join the coaching staff, while completing their degrees in Human Performance and Wellness with a concentration in sports management and Social and Behavioral Sciences, respectively. Both were known for their three-point shooting, as they rank in the top eight all-time for three-pointers made in a season at CSUMB.



#### **Head Coach Pat Kosta**

Now in his first year as head coach for CSUMB men's basketball, Pat continues his career after taking the helm from Bill Trumbo. Kosta started here as assistant coach and held that position for six years. During that period, he helped to produce eight all conference players as well as an NAIA Academic All-American. Prior to his coaching at CSUMB, he coached high school basketball for 15 years with Cardinal Newman and El Molino High Schools. Before that, he owned and ran Gym Rat Basketball, where he provided youth instruction and training.

Kosta is currently finishing his degree in Liberal Studies from Cal State Monterey Bay. He resides in Marina with his wife Tanya and their children, Julia and Charles.



#### **Assistant Coach Phranklin McKinnney**

Phranklin McKinnney is in his third year here as an assistant coach. He has worked alongside Bill Trumbo in the past and at Santa Rosa Junior College.

California State University, Monterey Bay is pleased to be a member of the California Collegiate Athletic Association. The CCAA has been one of the nation's most successful intercollegiate athletics conferences since its beginnings in December of 1938. In addition to CSUMB, other members include Cal Poly Pomona, Cal State Bakersfield, Cal State Dominguez Hills, Cal State Los Angeles, Cal State San Bernardino, Cal State Stanislaus, Chico State, UC San Diego, San Francisco State, and Sonoma State.

Over the years, CCAA programs have won 145 national championships, far and away the most of any NCAA Division II Conference. On the men's side, CCAA members have brought home 98 titles with 25 in swimming and diving, 16 in wrestling, 13 in track and field, 11 in tennis, and ten in baseball. The 23 years of CCAA women's athletics have been equally successful with ten titles in cross country, eight in softball, six in track and field, five in volleyball, and five in basketball as well as 18 in four other sports.

CSUMB sponsors the following sports in the conference: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, men's golf, men's and women's soccer, and softball.


