Coach Bios



Head Coach Andrea Kenney

Before coming to CSUMB last spring, Kenney had spent the previous five years as head coach at Claremont Mudd Scripps College. During her tenure there she produced 11 first team All-American Conference athletes and four All-Region selections. In 2004, CMS was runner-up in the southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference and set the school record for victories. Kenney got her start as the head softball coach at Southwestern College (California). In her five years there she had 17 all-conference selections, three all-region picks, and coached the Pacific Coast Player of the Year in 1995. Kenney then took charge at New Mexico Highlands from 1998-2000. In these three years she had 21 all-conference selections, 10 all-conference, all-academic players, and five all-region athletes. In 1999 and 2000, NMH was the rocky Mountain Athletic Conference runner-up and Kenney was the RMAC Coach of the Year in 1999.

A native of Santa Barbara, Kenney has a bachelor's in psychology from the University of San Diego, a master's in physical education from Azusa Pacific, and a master's in instructional education from National University. She currently resides in Marina with her daughter, Kristin.



Assistant Coach Angela Slaugh

A native of Bloomfield, New Mexico, Angela had an outstanding pitching career at Western New Mexico University (2001-04). Her career record was 113-23 with 1,206 strikeouts and a 0.85 ERA in 907 and one-third innings. Slaugh was a three-time All-Pac West Conference first team selection, three-time Pac West Pitcher of the Year,

three-time All-West Region first team pick and helped the Mustangs win three consecutive Pacific West conference championships. In 2004, she went 38-8 with 441 strikeouts and a 0.50 ERA in 302 and one-third innings. For the season, Slaugh was a second team All-America and MVP of the West Regional, helping her team advance to the NCAA Division II College World Series for the first time. Angela graduated with a B.S. in zoology.



Assistant Coach Shellie Broyles

A product of Alamogordo, New Mexico, Shellie had a strong career at Western New Mexico (2000-03). For her career she had 75 doubles, 33 home runs, scored 160 runs, drove in 159 runs and hit .367 in 203 games. Broyles was a three-time All-Pacific West Conference first team selection and a three-time All-West Region first team pick.

She won the Pac West Triple Crown (home run leader, hit leader, RBI leader) in 2003, and was twice the Pac West Player of the Year. Shellie was an NFCA third team All-American in 2003. Shellie also graduated with a B.S. in zoology.
