Dianne F. Harrison, Ph.D.

Dr. Dianne Harrison assumed the presidency at California State University, Monterey Bay in June 2006.

During a 30-year career at Florida State University in Tallahassee, she served in various capacities starting as a faculty member then advancing to dean of social work, associate vice president for academic

affairs, dean of graduate studies, and vice president for academic quality and external programs.

She holds a Ph.D. in social work from Washington University in St. Louis, and a master's of social work and a bachelor's in American studies from the University of Alabama. A prolific researcher and writer, Dr. Harrison has published dozens of articles and two books.

She has served on the boards and committees of over 50 national, state, and local organizations and community projects. Under the auspices of the Florida State University School of Social Work, she helped to found the nationally known Boys Choir of Tallahassee.

Dr. Harrison and her husband, John Wujack, live on campus. Dr. Harrison has two children, Melissa Montgomery (24 years old) and John Paul Montgomery (21 years old). She grew up in Mobile, Alabama and Short Hills, New Jersey.

Howard recently began his inaugural year as the CSUMB Athletic Director. He has over 20 years experience in college athletics and was most recently the athletic director at Southwest Minnesota State University. Gauthier received his B.A. in Business Administration from Washington State University, an M.S. in Sports Management from St. Thomas University in Florida, and a Ph.D. in Education from Southern Illinois University.

Dr. Borrego has served in a variety of Student Affairs roles including associate vice chancellor/dean of students at the University of Arkansas, and associate dean and director of the Office for Minority Student Affairs at California Institute of Technology (Caltech) in Pasadena,

Borrego received her B.A. in speech communication from Northwest Nazarene College, an M.A. in social science from Azusa Pacific University, and a Ph.D. in higher education from Claremont Graduate School.

Not only do we love to play softball together, we spend a lot of our free time together as well. I don't think anyone will take CSUMB softball lightly."

Megan Russo (Monterey High School), a sophomore, feels the same way: "We love each other and the university we play for. I never considered leaving Monterey, or playing where my family could not watch me."

Coach Bios



Head Coach Andrea Kenney

Before coming to CSUMB last spring, Kenney had spent the previous five years as head coach at Claremont Mudd Scripps College. During her tenure there she produced 11 first team All-American Conference athletes and four All-Region selections. In 2004, CMS was runner-up in the southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference and set the school record for victories. Kenney got her start as the head softball coach at Southwestern College (California). In her five years there she had 17 all-conference selections, three all-region picks, and coached the Pacific Coast Player of the Year in 1995. Kenney then took charge at New Mexico Highlands from 1998-2000. In these three years she had 21 all-conference selections, 10 all-conference, all-academic players, and five all-region athletes. In 1999 and 2000, NMH was the rocky Mountain Athletic Conference runner-up and Kenney was the RMAC Coach of the Year in 1999.

A native of Santa Barbara, Kenney has a bachelor's in psychology from the University of San Diego, a master's in physical education from Azusa Pacific, and a master's in instructional education from National University. She currently resides in Marina with her daughter, Kristin.



Assistant Coach Angela Slaugh

A native of Bloomfield, New Mexico, Angela had an outstanding pitching career at Western New Mexico University (2001-04). Her career record was 113-23 with 1,206 strikeouts and a 0.85 ERA in 907 and one-third innings. Slaugh was a three-time All-Pac West Conference first team selection, three-time Pac West Pitcher of the Year,

three-time All-West Region first team pick and helped the Mustangs win three consecutive Pacific West conference championships. In 2004, she went 38-8 with 441 strikeouts and a 0.50 ERA in 302 and one-third innings. For the season, Slaugh was a second team All-America and MVP of the West Regional, helping her team advance to the NCAA Division II College World Series for the first time. Angela graduated with a B.S. in zoology.



Assistant Coach Shellie Broyles

A product of Alamogordo, New Mexico, Shellie had a strong career at Western New Mexico (2000-03). For her career she had 75 doubles, 33 home runs, scored 160 runs, drove in 159 runs and hit .367 in 203 games. Broyles was a three-time All-Pacific West Conference first team selection and a three-time All-West Region first team pick.

She won the Pac West Triple Crown (home run leader, hit leader, RBI leader) in 2003, and was twice the Pac West Player of the Year. Shellie was an NFCA third team All-American in 2003. Shellie also graduated with a B.S. in zoology.

California State University, Monterey Bay is pleased to be a member of the California Collegiate Athletic Association. The CCAA has been one of the nation's most successful intercollegiate athletics conferences since its beginnings in December of 1938. In addition to CSUMB, other members include Cal Poly Pomona, Cal State Bakersfield, Cal State Dominguez Hills, Cal State Los Angeles, Cal State San Bernardino, Cal State Stanislaus, Chico State, UC San Diego, San Francisco State, and Sonoma State.

Over the years, CCAA programs have won 145 national championships, far and away the most of any NCAA Division II Conference. On the men's side, CCAA members have brought home 98 titles with 25 in swimming and diving, 16 in wrestling, 13 in track and field, 11 in tennis, and 10 in baseball. The 23 years of CCAA women's athletics have been equally successful with 10 titles in cross country, eight in softball, six in track and field, five in volleyball, and five in basketball as well as 18 in four other sports.

CSUMB sponsors the following sports in the conference: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, men's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, and women's volleyball.
